

## **Fiction Assignment**

---

The fiction assignment is the first major assignment for this class. The fiction assignment:

- May focus on any kind of story, realistic or not. Some ideas include:
  - Basing the story on an event from your life, but changing the details or idealizing it.
  - Writing a genre story: sci-fi, horror, romance.
  - Continuing a story that you began in an in-class writing.
- Must use the writing methods discussed in class including:
  - Narrative Arc
  - Fiction Style
  - Fiction Organization
  - Showing Not Telling
- Should follow English written format, including paragraph structure.
- Must be at least 4 pages. These must be typed on a computer and double spaced (In MS Word, change 줄 간격 from 1 줄 to 2 줄. In Hangul, change 줄 간격 from 160% to 300%). The font can be no larger than 12 pt.

If your format, spacing, and font are correct, your paper should look like this:

This assignment will be turned in twice, once for peer review and once for grading. Both drafts must be 100% complete when they are submitted. In addition to the usual grading, your papers will also be graded on effort and improvement. Because of this, when you submit your paper for grading, you must also submit your first draft with the instructor comments written on it.

- Bring four copies on the day of peer review (three for other students and one for the professor). The peer review drafts are due on:
  - Monday, October 8<sup>th</sup> for the Monday/Wednesday class.
  - Tuesday, October 9<sup>th</sup> for the Tuesday/Thursday class.
- The final draft of the assignment is due on (please update the class schedule):
  - Monday, October 22<sup>nd</sup> for the Monday/Wednesday class.
  - Tuesday, October 23<sup>rd</sup> for the Tuesday/Thursday class.
